\$5,000

\$1,500

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KENNETH NEUMANN DESIGN SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,400

The Kenneth Neumann Scholarship will be awarded based on the design excellence portion of the submitted application portfolio. The scholarship includes a summer internship with the firm of Neumann Smith Associates in Southfield, Michigan.

PROFESSIONAL CONCEPTS INSURANCE AGENCY SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000

The PCIA Scholarship is to recognize and provide financial assistance to individuals with exemplary community involvement.

HED ALVIN ERNEST HARLEY AIAS GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000

Awarded in recognition to a deserving student who demonstrates an active participation and leadership involvement in the local AIAS Chapter.

JOHN BANICKI SCHOLARSHIP

\$2,500

Awarded in recognition of a student's academic and community achievements.

DANIEL W. TOSHACH & AIA SAGINAW VALLEY CHAPTER SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,200

Awarded to a deserving student with a well-rounded application and portfolio. Preference will be given to applicants from the area served by the AIA Saginaw Valley Chapter.

THE RICHARD M. & SIDNEY K. ROBINSON SCHOLARSHIP

\$3,500*

Awarded to a University of Michigan undergraduate (entering the fourth year) architecture student who aspires to a career that combines the roles of citizen and artist. This award is limited to University of Michigan students only, and is offered in cooperation with the Huron Valley Chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

THE LESLIE D. TINCKNELL SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,500

Awarded to a student that exhibits leadership in university and community life, and financial need.

ELIGIBILITY

All candidates must be:

1. Students who are completing or have completed their Bachelor Degree program and who have been accepted or are currently enrolled in a professional program in architecture leading to a Master of Architecture degree.
2. Resident of the State of Michigan and enrolled and attending the University of Michigan, University of Detroit/Mercy, Lawrence Technological University, Kendall College, or Andrews University.

* 3. The Robinson Scholarship is designated for an undergraduate student (entering the fourth year) at The University of Michigan only.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applications must be digital-only and submitted via email in PDF format no larger than 15 MB. Images shall not exceed 1024x768 resolution and 96 dpi. The files must be PC compatible, type no smaller than 10 point, and photos must be in .jpg or .pdf format.

The following data are required from each candidate:

1. An application form downloaded from the Michigan Architectural Foundation website.
2. A transcript of all college records.
3. A personal statement outlining the candidate's interest, experience and plans related to architecture.

4. A statement describing leadership, design and/or community accomplishments of the candidate.
5. An outline of extra curricular and public service activities.
6. A PDF copy of the student's design portfolio that was submitted for acceptance by the university to their graduate program.
7. Two reference letters from individuals familiar with your accomplishments. One of the reference letters must be by a faculty member from your university.
8. School costs and personal financial information as requested on the application.
