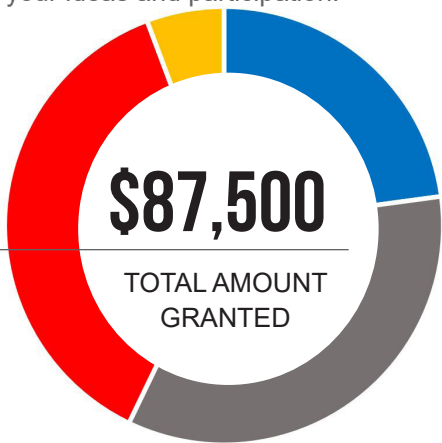

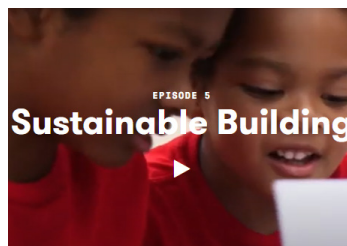


# BRINGING PEOPLE + ARCHITECTURE TOGETHER

Provide funding for architecture-related programs including films, events, exhibits, and educational initiatives that advance awareness and appreciation of architecture and demonstrate its influence on our lives. That's the impact of MAF's Architecture Awareness Grants

The grants provide financial assistance to organizations and individuals that organize, sponsor, and promote events, lectures, design competitions, publications, children's programs, educational initiatives, and experiences that connect people with architecture. Project Pipeline Architecture Camps, which are designed to introduce minority students to careers in architecture and take place in multiple locations throughout Michigan, are multi-year grantees.

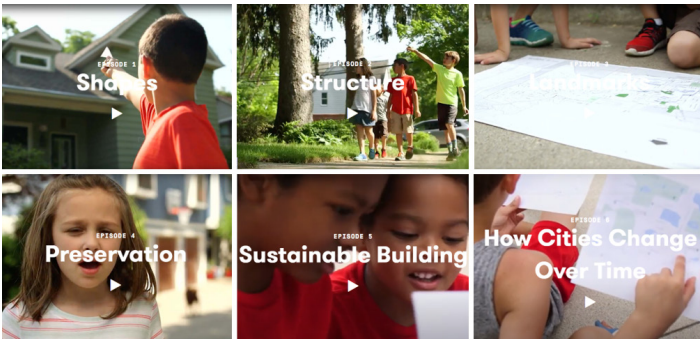

### EXPANDING THE REACH

#### MAF CHILDREN'S PROGRAM EXPANDS ITS REACH THROUGH THE MICHIGAN LEARNING CHANNEL-AND THE SUPPORT OF MAF'S ARCHITECTURE AWARENESS GRANTS



In 2022, MAF's K-12 Education Committee expanded its ArchiTreks adventure series by an additional two episodes (now to a total of six), through the support of MAF's Architecture Awareness Grants. ArchiTreks is aimed at getting kids excited about architecture, science, and engineering through fun segments that encourage them to explore their surroundings while engaging their imaginations, creativity, and critical thinking skills and provide physical exercise.

Last year, ArchiTreks, which was created and is produced in partnership with Detroit Public Television expanded its reach via the Michigan Learning Channel. The MLC hosts free programming including on-demand lessons and live TV, broadcast via special on-air channels established by each of the participating public television stations in Michigan. It is also available as a livestream and stored for on-demand viewing on a variety of digital platforms, ensuring accessibility to all students, teachers, and families across the state.

### RECOGNIZING THE CONTRIBUTIONS AND ADVOCACY OF MAF BOARD MEMBER, DAMIAN FARRELL, FAIA

Long-time MAF Board of Trustees member Damian Farrell, FAIA, passed away in February 2023. Damian also chaired MAF's Architecture Awareness Grants committee since 2012. As Chair, he advocated for organizations with programs designed to enhance awareness of architecture and was responsible for thousands of grant dollars being awarded to support these groups.

Through his leadership, he expanded the program's reach to benefit even more architecture-based programs that served Michigan residents of all ages. A devoted advocate for Michigan architecture, Damian was a role model for the kind of community impact that can result from dedication and vision.

# ARCHITECTURE ADVENTURES!

## EDUCATING THE NEXT GENERATION

Studies show thought processes that nurture creativity and critical thinking begin at a young age. MAF's educational-based resources are designed to help foster those processes in kids while stimulating curiosity about their surroundings, through fun activities that appeal to elementary school-age students (and they are available free of charge to children throughout Michigan).

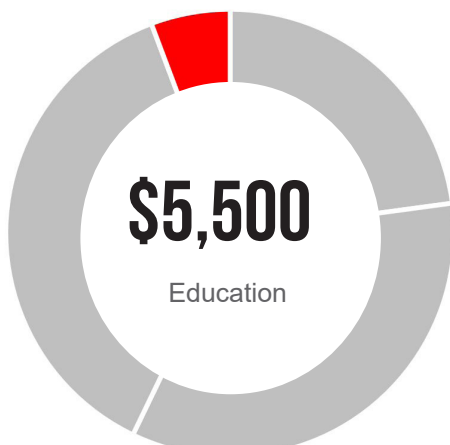
- **Let's be Creative!** MAF's Architecture: it's Elementary! is a multi-disciplinary educational curriculum designed to introduce students from kindergarten through grade five to architecture and the built environment. Developed with input from Michigan educators, the curriculum provides kids with critical STEAM-related learning opportunities, through lessons and activities that engage their minds, bodies, and imaginations.
- **Let's Go on an Adventure!** MAF's ArchiTreks is a video program aimed at getting kids excited about architecture, science, and engineering through segments that take kids on neighborhood adventures to explore shapes, structures, landmarks, and preservation, and pique curiosity about their surroundings. Created by MAF in partnership with Detroit Public Television (DPTV), each of the ArchiTreks video segments airs on the Michigan Learning Channel (MLC).

- **Let's Build our Imaginations!** MAF's Build Imagination Book and Toy Kits help to stimulate children's imaginations and lead them to explore architecture through reading and creative play. The Build Imagination Toy Kits are available at select libraries throughout Michigan. The Build imagination Book Collection is house at Birmingham's Baldwin Library and available to borrow statewide through the intra-library loan system.



## A BID FOR THE FUTURE MAF 2022 AUCTION FOR EDUCATION RAISES \$16,000

MAF's annual Auction for Education was held as two events: the first, during our annual Fore a Great Cause Golf Outing in May; the second, during the AIA Michigan/ AGC Mid-summer conference in August. Due to the outstanding support of the bidders, MAF raised \$16,000 from this year's auction, exceeding expectations. This year, thanks to generous donations from MAF Board Members, businesses, and construction partners, MAF had over 40 items up for bid. Items ranged from hotel stays, dining experiences, concert tickets, unique collectibles, and selections from several highly rated wine collections.



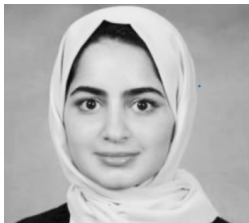
# DESIGNING THE FUTURE

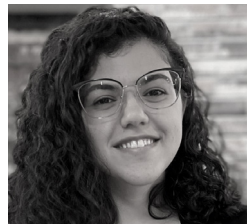

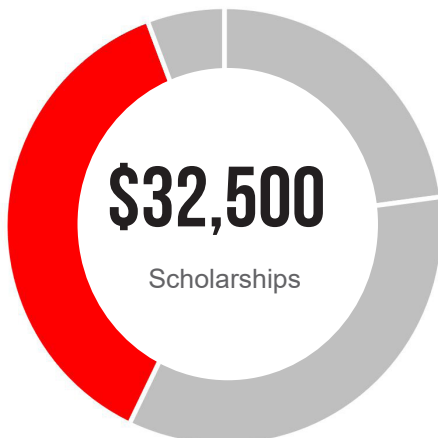

# PRESERVING MICHIGAN'S ARCHITECTURE

## EVANS GRAHAM PRESERVATION AWARD

MAF's Evans Graham Preservation Award grants provide financial assistance to groups and individuals seeking to preserve Michigan architecture. The \$20,000 Award is granted by a jury annually to a single project based on the merits of the project.

The Award was created in 1998 to honor the memory of preservation architect David Evans, FAIA. Ralph and Jeanne Graham, co-founders of the award, guided its development until their passing; the Award was re-named in 2015 to honor their leadership and contribution. Applications are evaluated by MAF's Evans Graham Preservation Award jury and the MAF Historic Preservation Committee.



## ANYTHING (BUT) CABIN FEVER!

### PALMER LOG CABIN KITCHEN RESTORATION RECEIVES MAF 2022 EVANS GRAHAM PRESERVATION AWARD

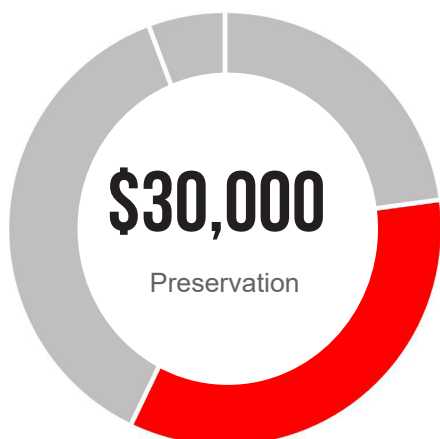
The People for Palmer Park (PFPP), and its project, Palmer Log Cabin in Detroit's Palmer Park, is the 2022 recipient of MAF's Evans Graham Preservation Award. The \$20,000 MAF grant is helping to fund the cleaning, reassembly, repair, and restoration of defining features of the 1885 kitchen.

Built in 1885, the log cabin's rustic log exterior encloses a Victorian interior with stained glass windows; paneled pocket doors; elegant window, door and base trim; and a beautiful carved wood staircase. The building was designed by architects George D. Mason and Zachariah Rice for U.S. Senator Thomas Palmer and his wife Lizzie Merrill Palmer. It was originally used as a summer home for the Palmers and venue for entertaining guests, including elected officials and notable historical figures such as Henry Ford, Frederick Law Olmsted, and Swami Vivekananda.
