# Introduction



Dwight Eisenhower was President, the average home cost \$12,200, and Architecture school tuition was \$100 per semester at the University of Michigan, when the Michigan Society of Architects decided to form a 501(c)3 supporting organization to undertake the fundraising support for the restoration of the Biddle House on Mackinac Island. The Michigan Architectural Foundation (MAF) was born and the first of many investments were made in Michigan architecture. The founders believed that the quality of life in Michigan is directly related to the quality of architecture, those that produce it and those that preserve it.

In 1977, the MAF led the fundraising to renovate and restore the historic Beaubien House in Detroit as the new headquarters for the American Institute of Architects Michigan. This was the second largest project undertaken by the MAF.

From 1957 to 1987, the Michigan Architectural Foundation Board of Trustees was the same as the AIAM Board. The transition from a concurrent Board to an independent Board was the start of truly investing in architecture. The returnon investment horizon went from short term to one that would

last in perpetuity, and the building of an endowment was started.

Today, the Michigan Architectural Foundation supports programs that increase awareness of the value of architecture, programs that educate children in the principles of architecture, scholarships for future architects and, as was the case in the beginning, historic preservation.

The Michigan Architectural Foundation is a trust with \$2.4 million in assets and generates \$90,000 a year in support of advancing our understanding of how architecture enriches our lives.

# The Damian Farrell Architecture Awareness Grant and Fund



This program has provided funding to organizations and individuals that have advanced the public's knowledge and appreciation of architecture throughout the State of Michigan. This program is funded through annual fundraising and the Damian Farrell Fund. In 2023, it was named after the Damian Farrell FAIA in honor of his 12 years of Chair leadership in developing this program.




