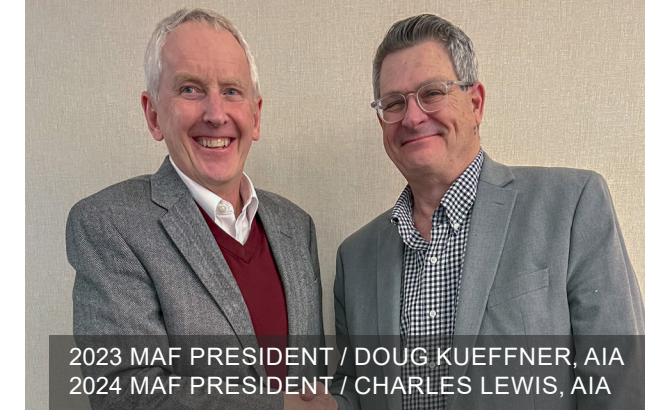

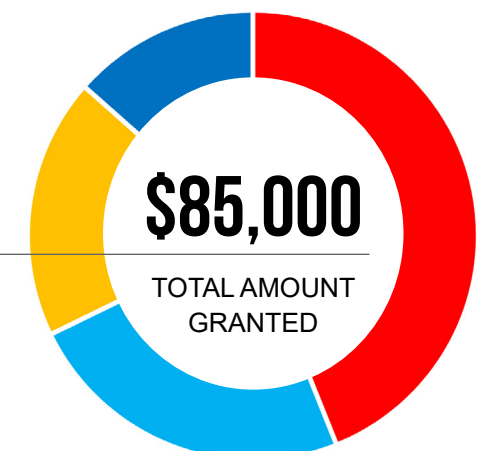
President's Message Chuck Lewis, AIA | 2024/2025 MAF President

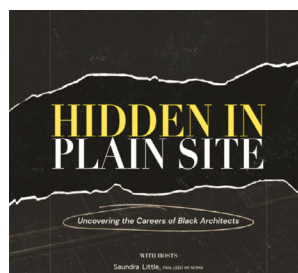

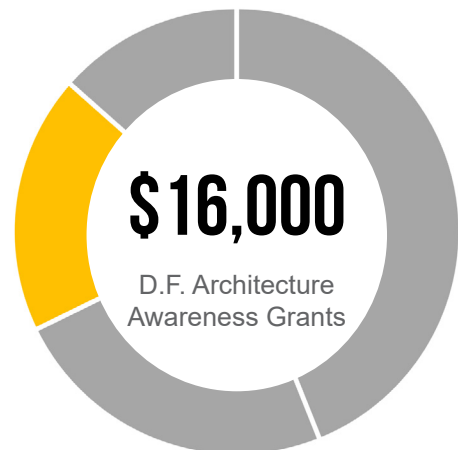

PRESERVING DETROIT'S MUSICAL HISTORY

DETROIT SOUND CONSERVANCY AWARDED EVANS GRAHAM PRESERVATION GRANT

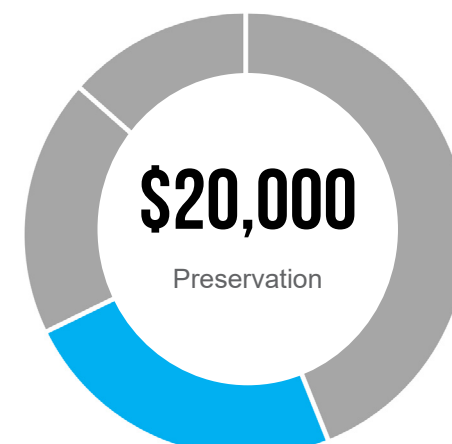


Detroit Sound Conservancy (DSC), and its project, The Blue Bird Inn, is the 2023 recipient of the Evans Graham Preservation Award. The \$20,000 grant is supporting the rehabilitation of the historic jazz club located on Detroit's Old West Side. The building will become a neighborhood music venue and multi-use community and arts space. The grant will help complete the restoration of the building's facade, masonry, and exterior envelope.

The Blue Bird Inn's former owners, Clarence & Mary Eddins, and The Dubois Family before them, were innovative Black entrepreneurs working to create opportunity in a heavily segregated Detroit. During the Civil Rights era, the club was a community hearth, where Black workers and their families could relax, commune, engage, express, and enjoy music.

The Award was created in 1998 to honor the memory of preservation architect David Evans, FAIA. Ralph and Jeanne Graham, co-founders of the award, guided its development until their passing; the Award was re-named in 2015 to honor their leadership and contribution. Applications are evaluated by the Evans Graham Preservation Award jury.

The Evans Graham Preservation Award grants provide financial assistance to groups and individuals seeking to preserve Michigan architecture. The \$20,000 Award is granted by a jury annually to a single project based on the merits of the project.

MAF LAUNCHES EDUCATION AWARENESS GRANT PROGRAM

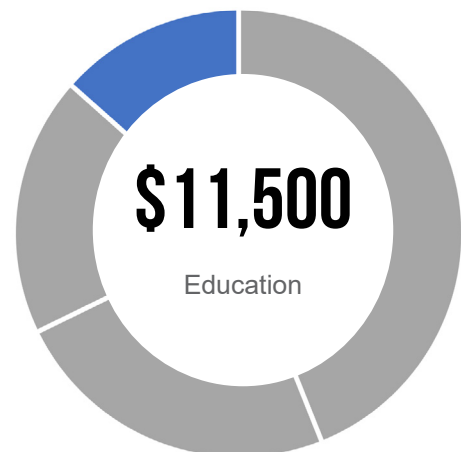
The Education Awareness Grant Program supports projects and programs that align with the mission of advancing awareness of how architecture enriches life. The goal of the grants is to reach out, engage, and promote awareness and education of K-12 students in Michigan as advocates of architecture and its contributions to our everyday lives.

2023 was the inaugural year of the new program, with grants awarded to six projects. Awards up to \$20,000 were available to a single recipient or multiple recipients throughout the state of Michigan.



The 2023 Education Awareness Grantees (and their projects) are:

- **THE ACE MENTOR PROGRAM OF WEST MICHIGAN** / Grand Rapids
For mentoring students in West Michigan in architecture, engineering, and construction.
- **THE BALDWIN PUBLIC LIBRARY** / Birmingham
Materials were supplied for STEAM Night programs in local schools.
- **THE BIRMINGHAM BLOOMFIELD ART CENTER** / Birmingham
For semester-long programs for 6-12 grades in Detroit schools.
- **THE GLEN ARBOR ARTS CENTER** / Glen Arbor
For materials for a “Gaudi-inspired” fairy homes project at the Art Center in the Summer of 2023.
- **THE MUNISING PUBLIC SCHOOLS** / Munising
For KEVA Planks for the 3rd-grade math classes to build structures.
- **NOMA (National Association of Minority Architects) “Project Pipeline”** / Detroit + Kalamazoo
To support free summer camps for students to engage in architecture and design activities.

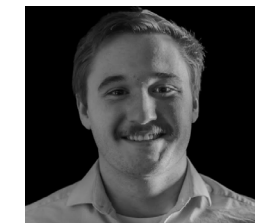


FUTURE OF ARCHITECTURE 2023 SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

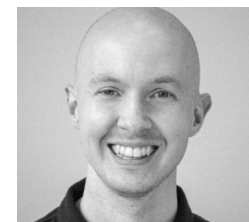

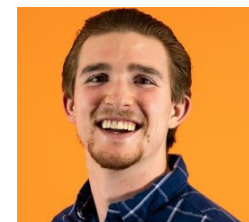

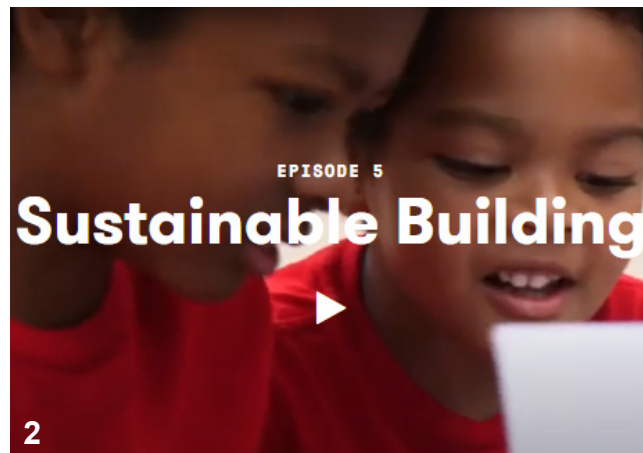
FREE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS FOR KIDS

Studies show thought processes that nurture creativity and critical thinking begin at a young age. The Foundation's free educational-based resources have been developed to foster those processes while stimulating children's curiosity through fun activities that appeal to young students.

1. **ARCHITECTURE: IT'S ELEMENTARY!** is a multi-disciplinary educational curriculum designed to introduce students from kindergarten through grade five to architecture and the built environment. Developed with input from Michigan educators, the curriculum provides kids with critical STEAM-related learning opportunities, through lessons and activities that engage their minds, bodies, and imaginations.



2. **ARCHITREKS** is a video program aimed at getting kids excited about architecture, science, and engineering through segments that take kids on neighborhood adventures to explore shapes, structures, landmarks, and preservation, and pique curiosity about their surroundings. Created in partnership with Detroit Public Television (DPTV), each of the ArchiTreks video segments airs on the Michigan Learning Channel (MLC).



3. **BUILD IMAGINATION BOOK AND TOY KITS** help to stimulate children's imaginations and lead them to explore architecture through reading and creative play. The Build Imagination Toy Kits are available at select libraries throughout Michigan. The Build Imagination Book Collection is housed at Birmingham's Baldwin Library and are available to borrow statewide through the intra-library loan system.

AN EVENTFUL YEAR

2023 EVENTS / RECAP

Each year, the Michigan Architectural Foundation hosts several events to recognize its supporters and donors; raise money to support educational programs and grants; promote networking and camaraderie among guests; and to help advance awareness of how architecture enriches life. The 2023 events included the following:

1. DONOR APPRECIATION EVENT

The event was held on April 27 at the historic St. Cecilia Music Center in Grand Rapids. In addition to celebrating MAF supporters and donors, the 2023 scholarship winners were also introduced at the event.

2. 'FORE A GREAT CAUSE' GOLF OUTING

The annual outing, held on May 22 at Plum Hollow Country Club in Southfield, brought supporters together for a fun afternoon of golf, networking, and to raise money for scholarships and education programs.

3. AUCTION FOR EDUCATION

This annual event features two separate live auctions. The first is held during the Fore a Great Cause Golf Outing in May; the second, during the AIA Michigan / AGC Michigan Midsummer Conference in August.

4. THE BANICKI SCHOLARSHIP FUND EVENT

The event, held November 9 at the War Memorial in Grosse Pointe Farms, honored long-time supporters Katherine and the late John Banicki.



A LEADER & HUMANITARIAN FOR ALL

CELEBRATING THE LEGACY OF THE LATE LESLIE D. TINCKNELL, FAIAE



Les was also president of Wigen Tincknell Meyer & Associates, Inc from 1976 until he sold his ownership in 1993. After his retirement in 1995, Les spent considerable time each week at the offices of WTA, attending to an array of pro bono projects for non-profit organizations. His work earned Les nearly every honor Saginaw could bestow upon him, including a Lifetime Community Service Award from the Saginaw County Chamber of Commerce, and the Child Advocate of the Year from the Child Abuse and Neglect Council, among countless others. Love of family was paramount to Les, and he and his wife Marion (who were married for nearly 70 years), raised four children in the mid-century modern home he designed.

In 2017, MAF launched the Leslie D. Tincknell Scholarship, which is awarded to a student that exhibits leadership in university and community life, and financial need. MAF and Les also established the Tincknell Fund, supported by gifts from individuals, companies, and other foundations. The Tincknell Fund was originally slated solely to support a small scholarship. But with their desire to expand the financial impact of their scholarship, Les and his wife Marion also made substantial personal contributions to the fund. The Tincknell Scholarship is now an annual award of over \$8,000, one of the largest scholarships awarded by MAF. (In 2024, the Tincknell Scholarship will be an award of \$10,000, the largest scholarship granted by MAF).

Several of Les' former colleagues, fellow architects, and Foundation board members cited Les for his warmth, thoughtfulness, generosity, integrity, humility, grace, and for being a true mentor and friend. One noted that Les had been referred to as an 'ageless spirit' who was always upbeat, asking everyone how they were doing, and staying tirelessly committed to everything he was involved in.

Thank you for your contributions, Les, and for the legacy you left to all of us.

It is rare for an individual to have such a positive and lasting impact on everything he touched as Leslie D. (Les) Tincknell, FAIAE, did. Les sadly passed away on January 17, 2024, leaving a profound legacy for the people, profession, and the Foundation he loved.

Les was instrumental in building and growing the Foundation. He served on the board for 30 years, in roles including president and treasurer, and on multiple committees. As treasurer, under Les' financial leadership, the Foundation endowment more than quadrupled. In 2016, Les received MAF's Leadership Award.
